THE CROSS

THE CROSS is one of the most visible symbols of our faith. The cross identifies us with Christ. We use the cross to proclaim to the world the victory of our own resurrection of life. The cross is place on the top of our church so that even in brick and mortar all may know that we gather to celebrate the Christian faith.

The challenge for many in their encounters with, and contemplation of, the meaning of the cross continues to be how an instrument of torture and death can also be the reason for celebration. How do we find glory in suffering and shame? How can we claim victory in an event that is, indeed, a defeat? How can we celebrate life in death? We have asked, or rather I should say that non-believers have asked, these questions throughout the ages. The answer is in us—the bearers of the cross—in our testimony of the power of the cross in our life.

Saint Paul addresses these questions and the challenge of the cross in his Epistle to the 1 Corinthiains 1:21-24: "For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."

The way of the cross led us to Jesus' resurrection and *our* resurrection. We who are dead in our trespasses are made alive together in Christ, having our sins forgiven. All that was against us and destroying us was nailed to the cross: "And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses, having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross. Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it" (Colossians 2:13-15).


We give glory and show victory to the world by our cross. We proclaim, as Saint Paul says, "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Galatians 2:20).

We celebrate the feast of the cross two times in the liturgical year. On the third Sunday of Lent, we celebrate the Veneration of the Holy Cross and on September 14 we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

The cross is a symbol of protest and defiance against evil and sin. It is the alternate, non-violent way to show our expression of wrongfulness. I say "non-violenct" in this horrible time of uprising against the killings of so many people in the name of Islam. I am appalled that, in New York, at the place of the Twin Towers, where our own little church of Saint Nicholas once stood, atheists have sued the National September 11 Memorial and Museum for the removal of their planned presentation of the World Trade Center's cross-shaped steel beam. This cross became a famous Ground Zero symbol. This cross was formed when two beams fused together and landed upright as the World

MY HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL COACH always used to tell us to "expect the unexpected." I thought of my old coach recently as we began the process of re-striping our parking lot. A project that was initially expected to cost approximately \$2,500 had to be delayed and re-examined when we discovered considerable wear and damage to our existing lot that made continuing the project impractical.

Our parking lot is old and numerous fissures, cracks and "alligatoring" have developed over the years. These are not the kind of things most of us notice, but I can assure you, these seemingly small cracks and fissures will become tomorrow's pot holes and major maintenance and upkeep headaches. We contacted four firms for repair estimates and the average bid came in at about \$35,000 to effect necessary repairs. Although funding such an unexpected expense would have been difficult, we could have managed. However, we soon learned simply making repairs of this nature doesn't necessarily address longer term issues associated with overall lot maintenance. Let me share our path of discovery with you and the logic we applied to this situation:

There are several problems with electing to pursue a course of action that would result in the repair of the damaged portions of the lot. First, although not intuitively obvious, each new "repair" introduces multiple additional potential points of failure. What that means is that even though the edges of the repaired area (which joins the existing lot) are sealed, the opportunity for compromise leading to additional cracks and potholes becomes significantly greater. This is why you see potholes repeatedly spring up in the same areas, near previous repairs in our local streets and roads. Secondly, while implementing repairs fixes the damaged areas in an old lot like ours, the surrounding older lot continues to age and deteriorate, eventually requiring additional repairs to those areas at additional cost. Finally, repairs of the nature described above typically only last about four (4) years. So it's easy to see that such repairs on an old lot like ours could rapidly develop into major annual repair expenditures.

After examining the situation very carefully and consulting with several experts and engineers, it is our collective wisdom the most prudent course of action would be to refrain from making any repairs this year, but to sequester the amount of money equivalent to what we would have paid for repairs (\$35,000) and place it into a special restricted account to be used to resurface the *entire* parking lot next year. This would give us the opportunity to identify approximately \$50,000 of additional funds out of next year's capital improvements and maintenance budget which would enable us to initiate this project early next summer. Although this option is more expensive in the short run, such a move would ensure a minimum of 12 to 14 years on average life expectancy for the new parking lot as opposed to multiple, expensive patchwork repairs that would only yield four years of reliability and would put us in a never-ending cycle of making multiple expensive costly repairs year after year. This now becomes our number one capital improvement priority. (We'll discuss our list of priorities at our forthcoming General Assembly meeting on October 24 at 7:00pm.)

I appreciate there are numerous details associated with the issues that I've tried to explain in this column. If anyone has any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me and I'll be happy to discuss these areas with you in greater detail.

TO XPHMA

(Συνέχεια από το προηγούμενο) Σοφία Δ. Τσαγκάλη

ΈΝΑ ΘΕΜΑ, επίκαιρο πάντα, που συνέχεια έρχεται στο νου μας και μας απασχολεί, είναι το χρήμα. Στη περίπτωσή μας φυσικά είναι να καταστήσει σαφή τον πειρασμό του χρήματος, καθώς και τους κινδύνους, οι οποίοι απορρέοουν από αυτόν.

Ένας περίφημος Άγγλος συγγραφέας, ο Walter Scott, έγραφε μιά σπουδαία φράση: «Περισσότερες ψυχές πέρασαν στον θάνατο από το χρήμα, από όσα σώματα πέρασαν από την μάχαιρα». Η φράση αυτή θέτει το ζήτημα του χρήματος, ένα ζήτημα που όλοι μας το αντιμετωπίζουμε οπωσδήποτε σε μικρότερο ή σε μεγαλύτερο βαθμό, ένα κεφάλαιο που ειδικά η εποχή μας με την μεγάλη εξέλιξή της του δίνει πολλή σημασία. Μήπως δεν είναι η νοοτροπία των πολλών αυτή; «Χωρίς λεφτά δεν γίνεται τίποτε». Και δεν είναι οι πλείστοι των ανθρώπων γύρω μας υποδουλωμένοι στην επιθυμία κατάκτησης του χρήματος;

Τα γεγονότα λοιπόν δείχνουν ότι το χρήμα αποτελεί έναν ισχυρό πειρασμό, που μπροστά του βρισκόμαστε και μεις αναπόφευκτα. Πώς όμως θα πρέπει να τον αντιμετωπίσουμε για μην υποκύψουμε και να μην υποδουλώσει και μας;

Πρώτα-πρώτα ας κατανοήσουμε καλά τί είναι το χρήμα. Είναι ένα μέσο για να εξοικονομήσουμε τα προς το ζην αναγκαία. Τίποτε περισσότερο. Με άλλα λόγια δεν είναι σκοπός, ώστε ο άνθρωπος να ζει για το χρήμα, να έχει δηλαδή συνεχώς το μυαλό του και την ψυχή του κυριαρχημένα από την επιθυμία της συσσώρευσης χρημάτων. Οι πιο πολλοί κάνουμε το λάθος και βάζουμε το χρήμα ως σκοπό της ζωής μας.

Αυτό όμως έχει άμεση σχέση με το θέμα που λέγεται «ανάγκες». Είναι λίγες ή πολλές οι ανάγκες σήμερα στον κόσμο; Στην εποχή μας οι «ανάγκες» διαρκώς αυξάνουν καθημερινά με γοργό ρυθμό. Το κάθε τι γίνεται «ανάγκη», το ραδιόφωνο, το smart phone, η τηλεόραση, ο υπολογιστής, το αυτοκίνητο, το ταξίδι, το κινητό, το διαδίχτυο και τόσα άλλα. «Είδος πρώτης ανάγκης» θεωρείται το οποιοδήποτε καινούργιο. Οι «ανάγκες» ζητούν χρήμα, αλλά και το χρήμα δημιουργεί, όπου υπάρχει, «ανάγκες». Κατ' αυτόν τον τρόπο λοιπόν γίνεται, όπως λέμε στην καθομιλουμένη, ένας φαύλος κύκλος.

Γίνεται φανερό ότι το ζήτημα είναι να καθορίσουμε τα όρια των «αναγκών». Σίγουρα μπορεί να γίνει κάτι τέτοιο. Τα όρια αυτά ίσως καθορίζονται για βοήθειά μας και από εκείνα τα λόγια του αρχαίου σοφού Κλεάνθους: «Ποιός είναι ο πλουσιώτερος; Αυτός που αρκείται στα λίγα». Αλλά και ο απόστολος Παύλος επίσης καθορίζει: «Έχοντες διατροφάς και σκεπάσματα τούτοις αρκεσθησόμεθα» (Α΄ Τιμόθεον 6:8). Είναι όντως χαρακτηριστικό ότι ο Απόστολος συνδέει τα δύο θέματα «αναγκών» και πλούτου, γιατί ακριβώς στη συνέχεια λέει: «οι δε βουλόμενοι πλουτείν εμπίπτουσιν εις πειρασμόν και παγίδα και επιθυμίας πολλάς ανοήτους και βλαβεράς, αίτινες βυθίζουσι τους ανθρώπους εις όλεθρον και απώλειαν» (Α΄ Τιμόθεον 6:9).

BOOK REVIEW

The Holy Trinity: In the Beginning There Was Love . Fr. Dumitru Stăniloae. Translated by Roland Clark. Brookline, MA: Holy Cross Orthodox Press. 2012. 94 pages. \$16.95.

Fr. Dumitru Stăniloae (1903-1993) was a priest of the Church of Romania. His numerous works, including a Romanian translation of the Philokalia and his 1978 masterpiece *The Dogmatic Orthodox Theology* have established him as one of the leading Orthodox theologians and academicians of the 20th century.

The Holy Trinity is one of a growing number of his works available in English. Stăniloae grounds this exposition on the loving nature of the Godhead within an intellectually consistent framework of Orthodox dogmatics and sacred Tradition. Quotes from Church Fathers and Scripture underpin his arguments throughout. The prose of this translation is fairly formal, as might befit an academic, but still accessible. The little book doesn't require one to be a theologian to appreciate it, but it requires some work on the part of a lay reader. You can expect to be richly rewarded for your effort.

The first two chapters are the weightiest, as Stăniloae takes us through a proof of the necessity of God's existence, concluding, "There must be a being in itself, perfect from eternity, in which there is nothing that preceded it" (p. 5). That being's omnipotence and omniscience are "placed at the service of [its] unlimited goodness, which desires that limited created things enjoy its love, with a joy that gives them the power to love and to draw nearer to infinite goodness" (p. 12).

Chapters 3 and 4 are devoted to establishing the necessity of God's triune nature: "If the divine being were in a single person, it would not be good or loving from eternity, which would mean that it was not divine (p. 17).... A solitary being cannot even be human, let alone God. Its light and joy only exist in communion with other conscious beings" (p. 33).

In Chapters 5 and 6, the prose becomes ever more uplifting as Stăniloae describes the Divine Love revealed in Christ and the Incarnation. The nature of an intimate, cosmic love challenges us: "If dominion in [God's] kingdom belongs to the Trinity, humans cannot participate in the kingdom without uniting themselves with it, and living, through its power, in community with other men" (p. 46).

Chapters 7 through 10 deal mainly with the Holy Spirit and bring a brightness into the flow of thoughts. Stăniloae describes the loving rapport between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and how, through the Spirit, we are invited by grace to stand before God with Christ as our true brother. The final chapter includes Stăniloae's translations of four traditional prayers, all beautiful reflections on the Holy Spirit and the Trinity.

Although Stăniloae doesn't write at length on interpersonal bonds in light of the loving Trinity, pointed observations on human relationships run throughout the book. It is impossible to get through Chapter 7 without being struck by the family as a vision of the love of the Triune God. Those with children should find the resonance to be loud and clear. Stăniloae's understated observations on the increase in mutual love growing from an ever-maturing experience of God are often profoundly affecting and are among the book's most valuable insights.

MISSIONS AND OUTREACH

Missions and Outreach Meeting. The Missions and Outreach committee will meet on Tuesday, October 9, 7:00pm. All are welcome to attend.

Update on August Hoppe Visit. We were honored to have Nathan Hoppe and his family visit our parish on Tuesday night, August 21 to make a special presentation on their work in Albania. Nathan is the longest-serving Orthodox missionary. He has been in Albania for 14 years, working closely with Archbishop Anastasios in the resurrection of the Orthodox Church in Albania. Like all our Orthodox missionaries, they return to the states every two years to raise money for their living expenses for the next two years. Please consider making a financial contribution to Nathan so he can continue his missionary work in Albania. Checks should be made out to the OCMC and write Hoppe in the lower left. Update on Appalachian Project. As part of the work of the Metropolitan DC Missions and Outreach Committee, Fr. Costas Pavlakos led a team of 41 volunteers to Martinsburg, West Virginia from August 24-26, 2012 to support Habitat for Humanity critical repair projects. Our volunteers represented five Orthodox churches from the greater DC area and included a significant contingent of teens. It was a great experience for all concerned. Volunteers worked at three sites, making needed repairs to the homes of two disadvantaged seniors, and helping build a new house for a great family that had fallen on hard economic times. Our volunteers made electrical repairs, fixed shelves, installed a floor, shored up a deck, cleared brush and debris, weatherized and re-sided a room, and literally raised the walls at the new house. On Sunday, our group participated in the Divine Liturgy at the Dormition of the Virgin Mary Greek Orthodox Church in Winchester, Virginia, where the congregation generously hosted a breakfast for us after the liturgy.

The mission to West Virginia served to reinforce the commitment of our faith to help the less fortunate. There was great fellowship during the mission and we are discussing the possibility of future missions with Habitat and other groups with similar objectives. GOYA has already committed to helping with one of the projects.

Samaritan's Feet. Thanks to everyone who donated shoes for the children. A large number of shoes were collected and will be distributed by Samaritan's Feet to needy children in the area. We hope to become a distribution center for Samaritan's Feet next year.

Guatemala Mission Update. We are sorry to report that our Guatemala mission trip in January 2013 has been cancelled. We will announce a new date for 2013 shortly.

Update from Tanzania. Maria Roeber, an RN that Saint Katherine and others are funding in Tanzania, continues to faithfully serve in the Holy Archdiocese of Mwanza under the omophorion of His Eminence IERONYMOS. She has been investing a considerable amount of her time in help-

ing to re-establish the medical operations of the church's health center in Bukoba, which has included hiring medical staff, helping to establish pharmaceutical inventory systems and procedures, and generally serving in a key administrative role to facilitate this vital ministry of the Church.

Helping to plan and coordinate short-term team ministry in the field has also become a major component of Maria's work. She was involved in the advance work for an OCMC teaching team providing catechism to a group of approximately 70 Tanzanians in July and August at Kasikizi. She is presently involved in assisting with a short term medical team jointly sent by Saint Paul of Irvine, California and Project Africa Global. This team of 17 healthcare professionals is working in several locations: in the Orthodox health center in Bukoba, in rural villages doing outreach clinics, and in the local government hospital where the Orthodox health center refers its more complicated cases. By doing rural outreach, members of the team will provide medical assessment, treatment, and medication to people who are remotely located from higher level medical facilities. By working in the Orthodox health center in Bukoba, they will provide medical care with the additional resources of more supplies and equipment than are easily transported to villages. Finally, by creating a partnership with a referral hospital, specialist physicians and nurses will be able to use the facilities of the hospital to do surgeries and other interventions that the health center cannot provide, while also engaging in two-way education between themselves and their Tanzanian counterparts.

Please continue to pray for (and support) Maria as she works diligently to advance the mission of the Church in Tanzania.

BAILEY'S CROSSROADS HOMELESS SHELTER

Survival and Hygiene Kits. At the request of the Bailey's Crossroads Homeless shelter, we will again prepare Survival Kits and Hygiene Kits for the shelter this winter. Since the shelter has limited bed space, they cannot accept all the people who need a place to stay. During the winter, the shelter will give those people both a hygiene kit and a survival kit. They need about 500 of each kit every winter. Last winter, Saint Katherine was able to provide almost 300 of each kit. We will again ask each organization of our parish to provide 1-2 items for the kits. These will be assembled on Stewardship Sunday, October 28. What a wonderful way to demonstrate stewardship!

Feed the Homeless. We continue to cook for and serve the homeless dinner once a month. Our Parish Council will do this in October. All groups are encouraged to take a month. Contact Dr. John Demakis for more information (demakis9931@gmail.com)
